Found this on a website asking who can identify this rocket, it's the only photo ever found without any information about it.

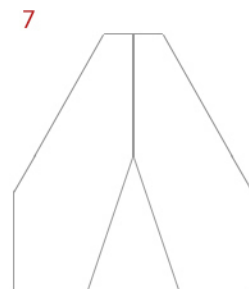
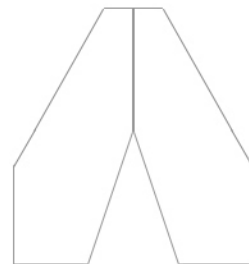
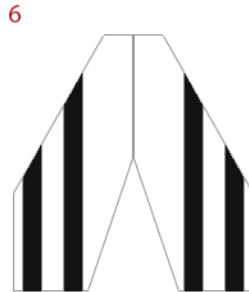
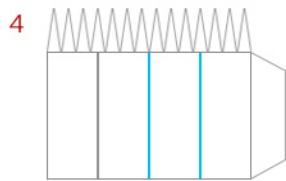
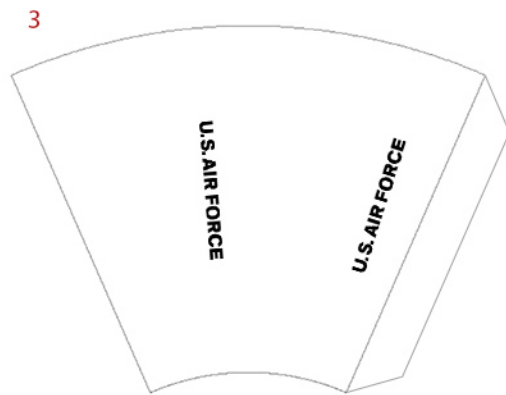
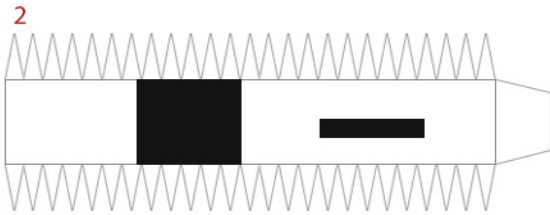
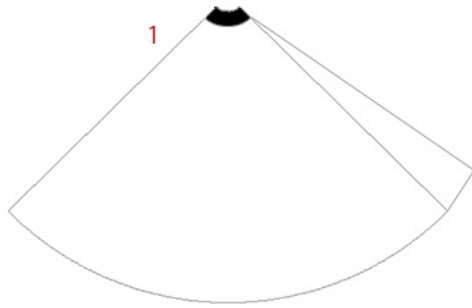

Because of this, I made two versions of the model with different lower sections, one of them should be close to resemble the real thing.

Score-fold each of the four fins in half at the center line.

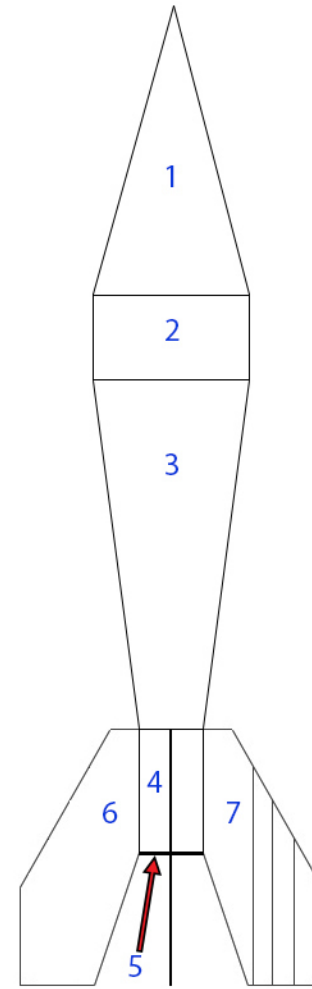
## Instructions

Keep all seems aligned during assembly.

5 is glued to bottom of the rocket.

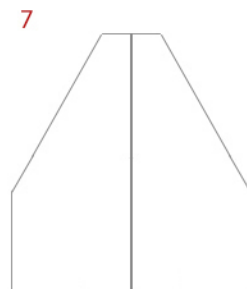
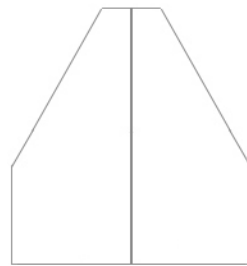
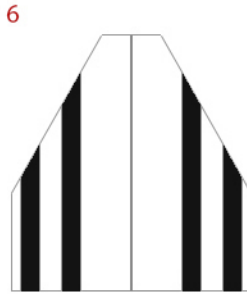
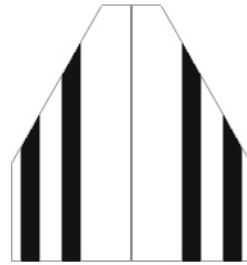
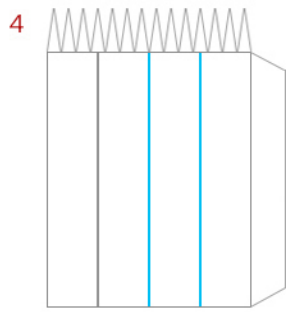
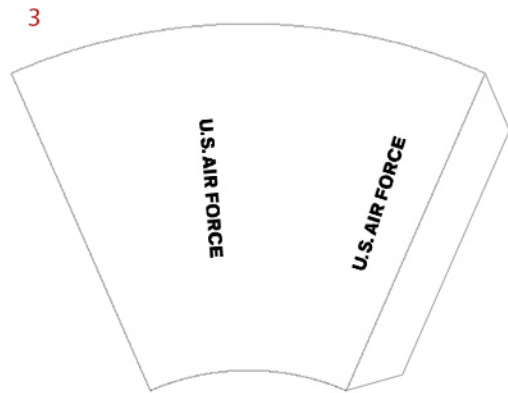
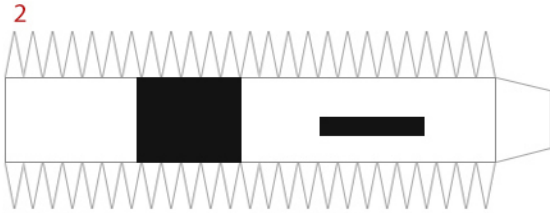
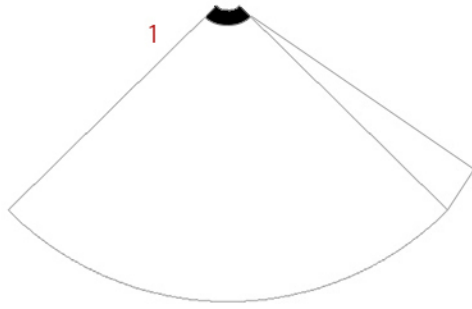
Glue the fins with the black stripes (Parts 6) on the two BLUE lines on the bottom (part 4).
